The social sciences of transfusion medicine - understanding donors and donation

Description

This workshop will introduce the social science of transfusion medicine, and discuss theories and methods used in donation studies. It will include four panels featuring leading scholars in the field, entitled: "Foundational Insights: Introduction and Lessons from Social Science Research in Transfusion Medicine"; "Broadening the Scope: Innovative Approaches and Methodologies for Social Science Research in Transfusion Medicine"; "Multidisciplinary collaborations: when social science and lab science meet in transfusion medicine"; and "From Insight to Impact: Overcoming Knowledge Translation Challenges for Social Science in the Blood Service." The workshop will demonstrate how this field is relevant for blood services internationally.

The international transfusion practitioner journey and beyond

Description

This full day workshop will provide participants with an overview of the Transfusion Practitioner role, how it began, how countries have recently implemented the role, and how the role has evolved with the changes in the blood sector. In the afternoon session Professor Keogh will focus on how the Transfusion Practitioner, and other transfusion colleagues can be involved in audit and research to measure clinical practice and effectiveness compared to professional standards and targets. The discussions will take audit as a starting point and will then discuss moving the audit paradigm towards a research approach to evaluate uptake of clinical interventions and/or systems of care. Discussion groups will consider the key indicators and metrics required, the use of scientific literature to support both approaches and strategic ways to feedback findings and data. The clinical focus will be iatrogenic anaemia due to blood loss from diagnostic testing.

How to review an article: Interactive workshop with the experts

Description

- 1. To increase participants' knowledge, experience and confidence with critically reviewing papers
- 2. To help participants gain practical tips about how to review, write and design high quality research projects and papers
- 3. To enable interactive discussion and learning with experts in literature review

Being able to review, critique and analyze scientific literature is a key skill, given the high numbers and large range of papers which are published daily.

- How do we judge whether a study was well designed?
- How do we know if the study results are reliable and relevant?
- How do experts pick their 'top' papers?

In this interactive workshop, experts from the ISBT/Systematic Reviews Initiative "Transfusion Evidence Round–Up" program will guide participants through the process of how to critically review scientific papers, and take participants through a real–life example of how a "Transfusion Evidence Round–Up" is done including: abstract and full text review, how to assess quality and bias in different study types, how to do PICO summaries.

There will be small group breakout sessions led by workshop facilitators, in which participants will work through example papers from a recent Transfusion Evidence Round–Up. Participants will be given practical tips about how to review papers and how to identify the key elements of a high quality paper/study design.

Participants with a diverse range of previous experience with literature review are welcome; including beginners and those who already have experience with writing and reviewing scientific papers.
